

MANIFESTO

The international community has committed to stop AIDS from being a public health issue by 2030. However, we will not be able to achieve this goal if we forget the most vulnerable populations: men who have sex with other men, sex workers, transgender population, prison population, drug users or indigenous population. In many countries of the world, these populations continue to be stigmatized, criminalized and forgotten by their governments and by society, making difficult their access to health programs and violating their human rights.

This neglect has caused that the financing of programs focused on these populations, key in the response to AIDS, depends mostly on international cooperation, which in recent years is stagnating or shrinking, especially in countries that have become middle income, according to the World Bank classification.

Entire regions such as Latin America and the Caribbean begin to lose the support of international organizations and donor countries, without considering whether the governments will want or be able to fill that gap.

For this reason, the "NOBODY" campaign is born, uniting civil society organizations and experts from Latin America, the Caribbean and the rest of the world, to end the abandonment suffered by the populations most vulnerable to HIV / AIDS from international funders and their own governments.

Civil society organizations signing this manifesto want to ensure that NOBODY disappears from the fight against AIDS, and that each one fulfills its role. Therefore:



WE DEMAND TO DONORS AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS SUCH AS THE GLOBAL FUND TO FIGHT AIDS, TUBERCULOSIS AND MALARIA





THAT NOBODY **DISAPPEAR**

A change in the resource allocation policies that are abandoning the most vulnerable populations of middle-income countries and putting the power of ending the AIDS pandemic in the future and everything that has been achieved to date at risk.



FOR COHERENT ASSISTANCE

An Official Development Assistance policy that is updated for the new realities and in line with the Sustainable Development Goals: that does not focus on the obsolete concept of "reducing poverty" but rather social justice, inequity and international solidarity.



THAT THEY SUPPORT CIVIL SOCIETY AS THE DRIVER OF CHANGE

The creation of a funding mechanism by the Global Fund to fight aids, tuberculosis and malaria to cover the advocacy work by civil society in the countries it is no longer supporting economically. This is the only way to ensure governments make long-term commitments to AIDS and their citizens' health.



FOR A SAFETY NET

The creation of a "Safety Net" to immediately palliate the consequences of the closing of services in countries where international aid has recently been withdrawn without any guarantee that the government will take up the fight against AIDS in full.




FOR RESPONSIBLE EXITS

A protocol of action prior to an exit as a donor to a country which ensures the government will assume its responsibility and respect the human rights of the entire population, guaranteeing healthcare for all citizens and particularly the most vulnerable who are living with HIV. Prevention and treatment for all groups must be guaranteed without any exclusions.




WE DEMAND TO GOVERNMENTS OF LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN



FOR A LARGER BUDGET

An increase in the national healthcare budget and specifically in the funds earmarked for the fight against AIDS and services for the most vulnerable populations. The healthcare rights of all citizens may only be guaranteed with resources.



FOR A FIGHT AGAINST AIDS POLICY THAT LEAVES NO ONE BEHIND

Specific interventions for the most vulnerable populations, ensuring NOBODY is left outside the fight against AIDS.



FOR POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC SUPPORT FOR SOCIAL ORGANISATIONS

Specific political and economic support for civil society organisations so they may continue doing their work and provide prevention and care services for the most vulnerable populations wherever the government does not.



FOR THE PROTECTION OF EVERYONE'S HUMAN RIGHTS

Laws that protect the human rights of all citizens without excluding anyone and which guarantee everyone access to healthcare and medications.




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
